Gr. RR

Grade RR is a vital part of our primary school foundation, focused entirely on learning through play to support social, emotional, and cognitive development — without formal subjects.

Gr. R - Gr. 7

The primary school phase follows the CAPS curriculum but is enhanced through:

- **Vocational Skills:** Early exposure to technical skills like woodwork, electronics, and agriculture.

Our High School

Senior Phase: Gr. 8 and Gr. 9

This phase builds on the primary school model while introducing career-focused learning.

- CAPS Curriculum Enhancement: Learners follow the national curriculum but with deeper integration of practical skills.
- IT and Coding: Advanced programming and app development.
- Career Choice Preparation: Learners explore different industries through mentorships, job shadowing, and projects.
- Entrepreneurship Development: Learners start and manage small ventures.
- Industry Collaboration: Real-world projects with industry partners.
- Exit Option: Learners can leave after Grade 9 with vocational training (e.g., contractor's hand in construction, assistant in IT support, entry-level agriculture jobs).
- Assessment: Project-based learning, industry-related tasks, and portfolio development.

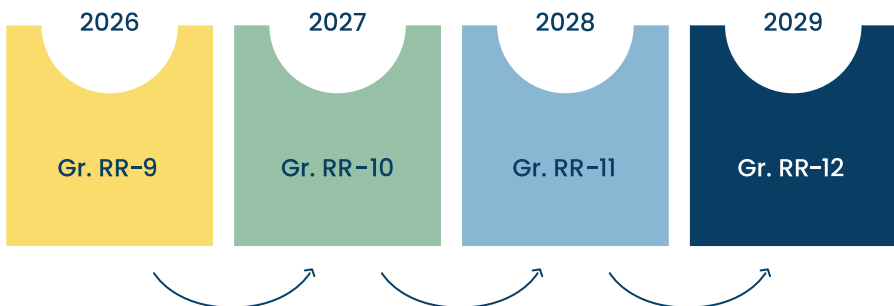

When our FET phase of the school opens in 2027, learners will be able to choose from three pathways, each focusing, to some extent, on the development of employable skills, entrepreneurship, workplace readiness, career preparedness, and job creation.



NSC Qualification with IEB examination.

- CAPS-aligned academic subjects leading to university entrance.
- Enhanced integration of IT, business, and vocational exposure.
- Practical application through real-world scenarios and industry partnerships.

NCV (National Certificate Vocational)

- Alternative qualifications emphasising industry-specific skills.
- Combines traditional subjects with technical applied training in fields that could be technical or non-technical training for example IT, electrical, mechanical, renewable energy, accounting or marketing.
- Learner's gain recognised vocational certification for employment or further studies.

Vocational/QCTO/Occupational Qualification

Application Procedure

How To Apply For Enrolment

Application forms are available at Lion Pride Academy.

An application form must be completed. All fields must be filled in and all supporting documents attached in order to process the application. The following supporting documentation must accompany the application:

- Copy of the student's birth certificate or ID.
- Copies of both parents' IDs. Should someone else be responsible for the academy fees, their ID should be included.
- Copy of parents or legal guardians' IDs.
- Where possible, proof of residential address that is not older than three months.
- copy of student's previous report.
- Consent-to-process-personal-information form.

Non-South African Citizens

Non-South African citizens whose parents are in possession of a permit for temporary or permanent residence issued by the Department of Home Affairs or whose parents have been recognised as refugees and are in possession of a permit issued in terms of the Refugees Act (No. 130 of 1998), may apply for admission to the academy. The following documents must be submitted as part of the admission application:

- Copies of both parents' passports
- Certified copies of asylum papers or residence permits
- Certified copy of study permit

Children who are not citizens of South Africa, who are not in possession of a study permit and whose parents are not in possession of a permit for temporary or permanent residence issued by the Department of Home Affairs, or whose parents have been recognised as refugees and are in possession of a refugee permit in terms of the Refugee Act (No 130 of 1998), may apply for admission to the academy, provided that all documents showing that parents has taken formal steps to legalise their stay in South Africa be submitted with admission application.

The academy reserves the right to verify all information and documentation supplied by an applicant for admission and reserves its right to take legal action against any applicant who intentionally provides false information.

The application process will span a duration of three to four days, during which applications will be reviewed in compliance with the admission policy.

Once a student is accepted, all relevant details will be captured on the academy database, at which time an electronic invoice for the enrolment fee will be emailed to the person responsible for the payment of fees.

A student is only active as a student of the academy once the enrolment fee is paid.

General

It will remain, at all times, the responsibility of the student's parents/guardians to ensure that the above documentation remains current on the academy's files. Should this not happen and any of the above documentation expire, the student's may be deregistered from the academy.





2026 School Fees

We are committed to providing quality education and an enriching learning experience for all our students. Below, you will find the necessary details about our school fees as well as the payment options.

Non-Refundable Enrolment Fees (once-off)

A once-off, non-refundable school application fee of **R500** is applicable upon enrolment. This allows the school to begin with your application checks.

Once approved by the school, a once-off, non-refundable enrolment fee of **R2 000** is payable per learner. The school will only place the learner in the grade once the full enrolment fee is paid and settled.

Payment Options

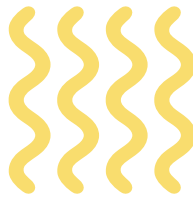
- 1 Full Payment: Pay the entire amount for the year upfront, due by 31 January 2026.
